



Tropical Storm Karen



Expected impacts to SE LA/ S MS:

· Winds:

25-35 mph over land and Lake Pontchartrain....40-60 mph near immediate coast and offshore. Hurricane force gusts possible in hurricane watch area.

· Seas:

Could rise to 15-20 ft – mainly east of MS River


Rain:


2-4" with locally higher (mainly across extreme SE LA and coastal MS)


Storm Surge:

1-3 ft West of MS River and Lake 3-5 ft East of River and MS coast Highest on East and Southeast facing shores











Wind Impact






TS Karen Wind Impact



- Maximum forecast winds are displayed in MPH
- Highest gusts are expected over marsh and marine areas
- Values are HIGHLY dependent on eventual track and intensity and could change with future forecasts.










Tropical Storm Wind Probabilities








Hurricane Wind Speed Probabilities








Storm Surge Impact








Rainfall Impact






TS Karen Rain Impact



- Heaviest rain will be across extreme SE LA and coastal MS. Rainfall is generally forecast in the 2 to 4 inch range with higher amounts possible.
- Most rain will fall tonight and Saturday
- Values are dependent on eventual track and could change with future forecasts.











Outlook for TS Karen



- Important not to focus on exact forecast track of center as this is a large, disorganized system with a diffuse center. Strongest impacts will be east of the center.
- <u>Track forecast</u>: The forecast has trended slower. Tropical Storm Karen is expected to cross southeast Louisiana Saturday night.
- Intensity forecast: The potential exists for Karen to become a hurricane before landfall



Onset of Tropical Storm Winds



- SE Louisiana coast (lower Terrebonne/lower Lafourche): late Tonight
- Plaquemines Parish: early Saturday morning
- Orleans Parish and inland portions of Coastal Parishes: midday Saturday
- Mississippi Coast: Saturday afternoon



Duration of Tropical Storm Winds



- SE Louisiana coast: 18-24 hours
- New Orleans + inland areas of coastal parishes: 18-24 hours
- Mississippi Coast: 18-24 hours



Expected Marine Impacts



- Winds: 25 to 40 knots with higher gusts over Lake Pontchartrain and Lake Borgne. 40 to 60 knots over the coastal waters. Gusts to hurricane force possible over the Hurricane Watch area.
- Seas: Seas building to 8 to 12 feet today. Seas peaking at 15 to 20 feet on Saturday.
- Improving conditions on Sunday.



Tropical Cyclone County/Parish Impacts Table


