She is currently working hard as the Key Club's team captain for the American Cancer Society Relay for Life. She is also a member of the National Honor Society, the French Club, International Culture Club. History & Law Club, Art Club, Student Council Member. Her leadership and compassion has helped so many people. the type of young person who is going to make our community a great place to live, and she is going to make others realize what a wonderful city Biloxi is. I am pleased to announce the 2009 Youth Volunteer of the Year-Cindy Nguyen.

We would like to recognize the Youngest Volunteer of the year. He is a first grader. Who at 6 years old on a mission to help a friend in need. He is a very kind hearted boy who has a passion for helping others. He wanted to help a friend who had cancer. He ask everyone at school to fill lots of jars with loose change for his friend. The two became buddies in gymnastics school. But when she was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, she was too sick to tumble. He missed his friend and worried about her a lot. "I don't want her to die, cause she's only 7-years-old and she's one of my friends. During a school lesson at Beauvoir, he shocked his P.E. teacher, Coach Capers, with a surprising announcement. "Coach Capers, I need to get 500 bucks for someone who has cancer.' Oh, okay," Capers said. "As he was talking, you could kind of tell that he had something else on his mind and he came out with that. And when you hear a 6-year-old say that, you know you've got to get involved." With help of several teachers he made a school commercial for the school news asking for loose changed from the students. He has raised over \$1000 now and is still collecting. He is a very inspiring young man that feels he can make a difference at 6 years old and he has, he is going to grow up achieving is goals in life and I am sure helping more friends in need. I am pleased to announce Carter Wells as our Youngest Volunteer for 2009.

The 2009 **Health Volunteer of the Year** has been a long time resident of Biloxi. She was displaced after the storm but her heart is still in Biloxi because that is where she grew up. She helped distribute important information to the local Vietnamese residents. She helped NAVASA (the National Alliance of Vietnamese American Service Agencies) and Boat People SOS provide services to the often marginalized Vietnamese community. While doing this work she saw a need for local Asian American organization on the Gulf Coast. In 2007 she and group of young Vietnamese professional started up an organization called Asian Americans for Change. She also saw a need of access to affordable healthcare, especially in East Biloxi. Because of her background as a pharmacist, she had the resources and connections necessary to put on a successful health fair. She decided to use those resources for the benefit of the community. The first health fair took place in March of 08, over 500 attended the most recent one was just this past weekend and was also very successful. What is unique about this health fair is that it was conducted in 3 different languages, English, Vietnamese, & Spanish. There were interpreters there who helped the residents as they get their free screening s, because language is one of the barriers to access to healthcare. She heads up the Health Fair annually out of the goodness of her heart and because of her genuine concern for the well-being of the community. It is with privilege that I announce the 2009 Health Volunteer of the Year, Kaitlin Truong.

The 2009 Arts & History Volunteer is a mover and shaker and has the vision to see things through. She is the owner of several century old properties with a vested interest in the beatification and redevelopment of the community. She loves to bring pieces of history back to life, while preserving the historical significance of each property. She has been on the Biloxi Main Street Board of directors for the past 6 years. It was because of her passion that the 100 year old Bond-Grant House was restored; she coordinated the efforts and put hundreds of hours of physical labor ripping out sheetrock, sanding, planting flowers and designing the landscaping, coordinating with contractors, getting donations and figuring out how finically this could happen. This was completed in June of 2008, and is benefiting the community each day. Because of her passion for Biloxi she saw the need to fill the empty buildings of the downtown area. She was able to convince several artists to open up in downtown with at pottery shop called Rue Magnolia Pottery located on Rue Magnolia. With in the past calendar year, she has initiated a new project that will have a significant impact on the vitality of the Main Street District. She located another building to open an artist co-op, this goal was achieved on February 14<sup>th</sup> when Gallery 782 opened. It is a Gallery of 40 artist located in the historic Sherer House on Water Street. She worked with Biloxi Main Street to rehabilitate the interior of this building to better meet the needs of the artist to support public and private art education programs and activities. She serves as Treasurer of the Board and is

chairing a special committee to host a major fund-raising event in May 2009 that features a book signing by a nationally known Mississippian who recently published him memoirs. This author helped raise more than \$30 Million for Hurricane Katrina relief efforts. At this time we present the, **2009 Arts and History Award Winner Laura Bolton**.

The Sports Volunteer of the year has been involved in the sport of swimming for the last 7 years. He has put forth endless volunteer hours to make sure swim teams have the best swimming experience available. He has been a timer at all of the meets which could not run with out volunteer timers. He has grilled burgers for the teams concession stands to feed all fo the hungry swimmers and visitors. He is always available to help stock the concession stand needs. He was a great help in putting together the 1<sup>st</sup> annual Santa's Best swim meet at the Natatorium in December 2008. The meet brought in over 300 swimmers from Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama and Florida. Endless hours of planning must go in to the hospitality areas so we can accommodate the needs of all the swimmers. He was also responsible for organizing and coordinating all of the military volunteers for the 3 day long meet. I am pleased to announce the 2009 Sports volunteer of the year is Alex Aranda.

The 2009 Military Volunteer has distinguished himself as a valuable force multiplier in regards to volunteer activities while serving at Keesler AFB in Mississippi. He participated in 81<sup>st</sup> MDG nurse and technician Booster Club Shoeshine Project benefiting more than 700 nurses and medical technicians. He shined combat boots for 6 hours. He helped raise \$ 400 for the 81wt training wing annual award banquet. He directed sale of tickets as 81<sup>st</sup> Inpatient operations squadrons' point of contact. He was a team leader for Relay for Life, his motivations has led to an all time high in contributions & He reflects the service before self concept through his teamwork. At his US Citizen ship and Immigration Service ceremony in the New Orleans District office. He led the Oath of Allegiance. There were 150 new citizens from 89 countries at this event. We would like to congratulate the 2009 Military Volunteer of the year is Airman First Class Rupert B. Laco.

The 2009 Volunteer Business of the Year- Raising money for charity has been a long-standing tradition. Just in the last 15 years they have raised over \$257,000.00 for 23 charities. The charity committee selects charities in June of each year and the fund raising period runs from beginning of June to the end of May the following year. All of the money raised comes from a variety of fundraisers within include ,raffles, home cooked meals, baked goods ,softball tournaments bowling tournaments, golf tournaments, cake walks , silent auctions garage sales, food/beverage booths and many more. Each employee who personally raises \$100 receives a ½ day off with pay. Employees who work for four hours for a charity organization or community service activity also, receive a t1/2 day off with pay. In 2008 Hope Haven & Pink Hearts received \$18,000 and they gave over 1000 hours in service. And in 2009 the Gulf Coast Women's Center for Nonviolence & Ocean Springs-Long Beach Interfaith Hospitality Network will be the charitable receivers. 2009 Business Volunteer of the Year is the Peoples Bank.
