





Community Development Activity Report July 11-17, 2016

Last week in Community Development, the Development Review Committee signed off on a site plan for a proposed office building at 13010 Kayleigh Cove for Land Surveyor Patrick Martino. The proposed structure will be one story, and will have 2,200 sq. ft.

On Tuesday, the City Council will conduct the second reading for Harrah's Master Plan Update, to allow for the construction of the Blind Tiger Restaurant on the south side of Beach Boulevard. The building design will still require Architectural Historical Review Commission approval.

There were 56 building permits issued last week, with a construction valuation of \$495,525. Four certificates of occupancy, and licenses for 2 new businesses were also issued. Building inspectors performed 102 inspections, and code enforcement officers opened 178 cases, and resolved 156.

Sales tax revenues collected for the month of June, again topped \$1 million. The \$1,035,775 total, was the fifth month this year that revenues have exceeded one million. It is also the first time since 2005, that we have exceeded one million dollars for five of the first six months of the year.
