




TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE	2,807

Last week in Community Development, the City Council voted to approve a zoning application for the former Santa Maria Del Mar Property to change the current zoning from NB-Neighborhood Business to CB-Community Business. Renovation plans have been submitted and are currently being reviewed for the proposed \$14 million, 154 suite structure that will be renamed The Watermark Hotel.

Also last week, the Biloxi Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve a tree removal application which will allow for the removal of seven small trees on the former Specialty Hospital Property, for the construction of a 100 room, Hilton Garden Inn & Suites. The four large Live Oak trees along the south and east boundary lines of the property will remain. As part of the mitigation requirements of the new Tree Ordinance, the developers will be required to provide replacement trees. The New Tree Committee will determine the location of the replacement trees which will be located either on the hotel property in a city park or cemetery or along a neighborhood streetscape. The Planning Commission also voted unanimously to approve the vacation of a remnant section of street right-of-way on Beach View Avenue to provide additional RV spaces for the Gulf Beach RV Park that is currently under construction. This recommendation will now go before the City Council for final consideration.
