





Last week in Community Development, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve an application to change the zoning for property located at 662 / 674 Beach Boulevard, and 661 Water Street from NB-Neighborhood Business, to CB-Community Business to allow a luxury hotel. The property is the site of the former Santa Maria Del Mar Apartments, and includes the former hotel property to the immediate east. The recommendation will now go before the City Council for final consideration. If approved, the hotel will include 154 suites, meeting spaces, a restaurant and a swimming pool. The Planning Commission also approved an application to change the zoning for property located to the west, and to the north, of the new Margaritaville Resort on Beach Boulevard, from WF-Waterfront, to CB-Community Business for the purpose of encouraging a family-oriented development.

Temporary Certificates of occupancy were issued last week for the Hyatt Place Hotel, and for Big Play Bowling Lanes, located on Beach Boulevard. The renovation plans have been submitted for the former Santa Maria Del Mar conversion to a hotel, and building plans have been submitted for the new Citizens Bank on Pops Ferry Road, a new Dollar General on Old Highway 67, and 4 new single family houses.

Lastly, monthly sales tax revenues for August totaled \$1,222,981.27, exceeding the one million dollar mark for the seventh time this year.
