





Last week in Community Development, the City Council conducted the first reading of a proposed ordinance change that would create a Health Care Industry Overlay District Classification and Zone. The second reading and discussion will be held at the council meeting this Tuesday. If approved, the new district will provide incentives for eligible new, or expanding health care facilities within a five mile radius of Merit Health Hospital at 150 Reynoir Street.

Also at the meeting on Tuesday, the City Council will conduct the first reading of an application to change the zoning for property located to the west and north of the new Margaritaville Resort from WF- Waterfront to CB - Community Business for the purpose of attracting a family friendly amusement development. A first reading will also be conducted for a zoning change application for the property including, and surrounding, the former Santa Maria Del Mar Apartments in order to convert the existing structure into a luxury hotel. The request is to change the zoning classification from NB-Neighborhood Business to CB-Community Business. The proposed hotel would have 154 suites.

Also this week, plans were received from Edgewater Village to build-out tenant spaces in the strip center for a Tuesday Morning retail store, Hibbett Sports, and a T-Mobile Cellular Sales Center. Building Permits were issued last week for four new single family homes.
