





Community Development Update 6/20/2016

Last week in community development, the Biloxi Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve an application from Harrah's Casino, for a Master Plan Amendment. The amendment approval, is for the site location, which is just east of the vacated Oak Street, south of Beach Boulevard. Because the property is located in the Point Cadet Historic District, the architectural designs will require AHRC approval. The planning commission also approved an application for a zoning change, and a conditional use, to allow the owners of property located at 12046 Lorraine Road to convert the existing structure into a riverside bar. All of these recommendations for approval will now go before the city council for final consideration.

Also last week, the city council conducted a first reading to consider an ordinance to establish Leisure and Recreation Districts. The second reading is on the agenda for this Tuesday's council meeting. The council also approved an application for short term rental for an existing residential structure located at 1378 Beach Boulevard, and tabled (subject to call) an appeal of the AHRC approval of the design for the La Quinta Hotel proposed for 950/956 Beach Boulevard.

On Thursday of this week, the Margaritaville Resort is scheduled to open. The \$14.1 million dollar renovated structure will have 373 hotel rooms, a rooftop waterpark, a rock climbing feature, zip lines, bowling lanes and a number of restaurants and other amenities. Certificates of Occupancy were issued for 4 structures last week, and 42 building permits with a construction valuation of \$220,300. Building inspectors performed 85 inspections and code enforcement officers opened 237 cases, and resolved 165.
